Two faculty guest speakers attended the meeting: Nadine Moeller presented on her excavations at Tell Edfu, Egypt, and Chris Woods provided a preview of the upcoming special exhibit on the origins of writing, which he is guest curating.

We had a number of changes to the makeup of the Visiting Committee at the end of the year. Jim Sopranos will step down as Visiting Committee Chair but remain on the Executive Committee. Harvey Plotnick was appointed as a new Visiting Committee member and will serve as our new Chair. Harvey Plotnick was President and CEO of Paradigm Holdings, Inc., until his retirement in 2007. He was formerly President and CEO of Molecular Electronics Co., and previously he founded and was President and CEO of Contemporary Books, Inc., which was one of the largest publishers of adult basic-education instructional materials in the United States. A 1963 graduate in English literature from the University of Chicago, Plotnick has chaired a number of its major fund-raising campaigns, including the \$650 million Campaign for the Next Century, which ended in 1996. He chaired the College and Student Activities Visiting Committee and was a member of the Alumni Association's Board of Governors and Chair of the College Visiting Committee. Plotnick has been a member of Argonne's Board of Governors since 2001. He is also a member, since 1994, of the University of Chicago's Board of Trustees. He and his wife endowed the Elizabeth and Harvey Plotnick Scholarship fund for undergraduate students, as well as a fund for graduate students in the Physical Sciences at the University. Please join us in welcoming Harvey to the Visiting Committee.

Patrick Regnery and Mary Shea will be leaving the Visiting Committee this year, and I hope you will join us in thanking them for their many contributions to the Oriental Institute.

Remembering Rita Picken

This year also marked the passing of Rita Picken, a true friend and generous supporter of the Oriental Institute.

Rita showed her love for the Oriental Institute not only through her involvement with the Docent program for over thirty years but also through her sponsorship of the Robert F. Picken Family Nubia Gallery and the recent special exhibit *The Life of Meresamun: A Temple Singer in Ancient Egypt*. At our 90th Anniversary gala in 2009, the Institute honored Rita with the James Henry Breasted Medallion — the highest honor that we give our Members and supporters to recognize their service and commitment.

Rita and her daughter, Kitty Picken, have been part of the fabric of the Institute for decades; Rita saw the people in the Oriental Institute community as a second family. She will be greatly missed.

In memory of her mother Rita, Kitty Picken and the Oriental Institute announced the endowment of the Rita T. Picken Professorship in Ancient Near Eastern Art, which will be supported by a \$3.5 million gift from Kitty. The professorship will enhance the work of the Oriental Institute by adding a faculty member whose expertise in ancient art will complement the Institute's strengths in languages and archaeology. The endowment of this professorship is a fitting tribute to Rita's love of art history and will be historic, given that it is only the second endowed chair in the Oriental Institute's ninety-year history.
